

What is an Associate Member?

Associates might provide business, sales, property and utility tax auditing and consulting services, hardware and software for all revenue applications, code enforcement, utility billing and cashiering, collection of bad debts and location of businesses. Some associates are other government agencies that have similar goals as CMRTA.

How do Associate Members benefit CMRTA?

The associate members provide a ready source of talent to help meet the needs of your city or county. They are also a reliable source of speakers for division meetings and the annual conference.

Continuing Education

What is the Certified Revenue Officer (CRO) Program?

A transformative initiative designed to elevate your professional journey and enrich the municipal revenue administration landscape. The CRO certification is achieved through an exam process based on mastering a level of knowledge obtained through educational training and work experience in a municipal revenue and tax collection position. The CRO Program is the gold standard in revenue administration and distinguishes you as a leader in your field.

Requirements for Certification

Candidates must:

- Have 4,000 hours of business license (tax) experience which may include:
 - Processing business license applications and renewals.
 - · Performing field enforcement procedures related to business licensing.
 - Performing audits for business license purposes.
 - And/or other experience which may be determined as applicable by the Certification Committee.
 - Complete a total of 30 hours of educational experience to include all required classes.
 - · Pass a comprehensive test demonstrating ability in a variety of areas of expertise.
 - Prepare and present a relatable topic via PowerPoint at one of the division meetings.

Once all requirements have been met, you may apply for certification. Complete the application and submit it with documentation of work history, class/training experience, and application fee. It is recommended that you keep records of each class you attend.
